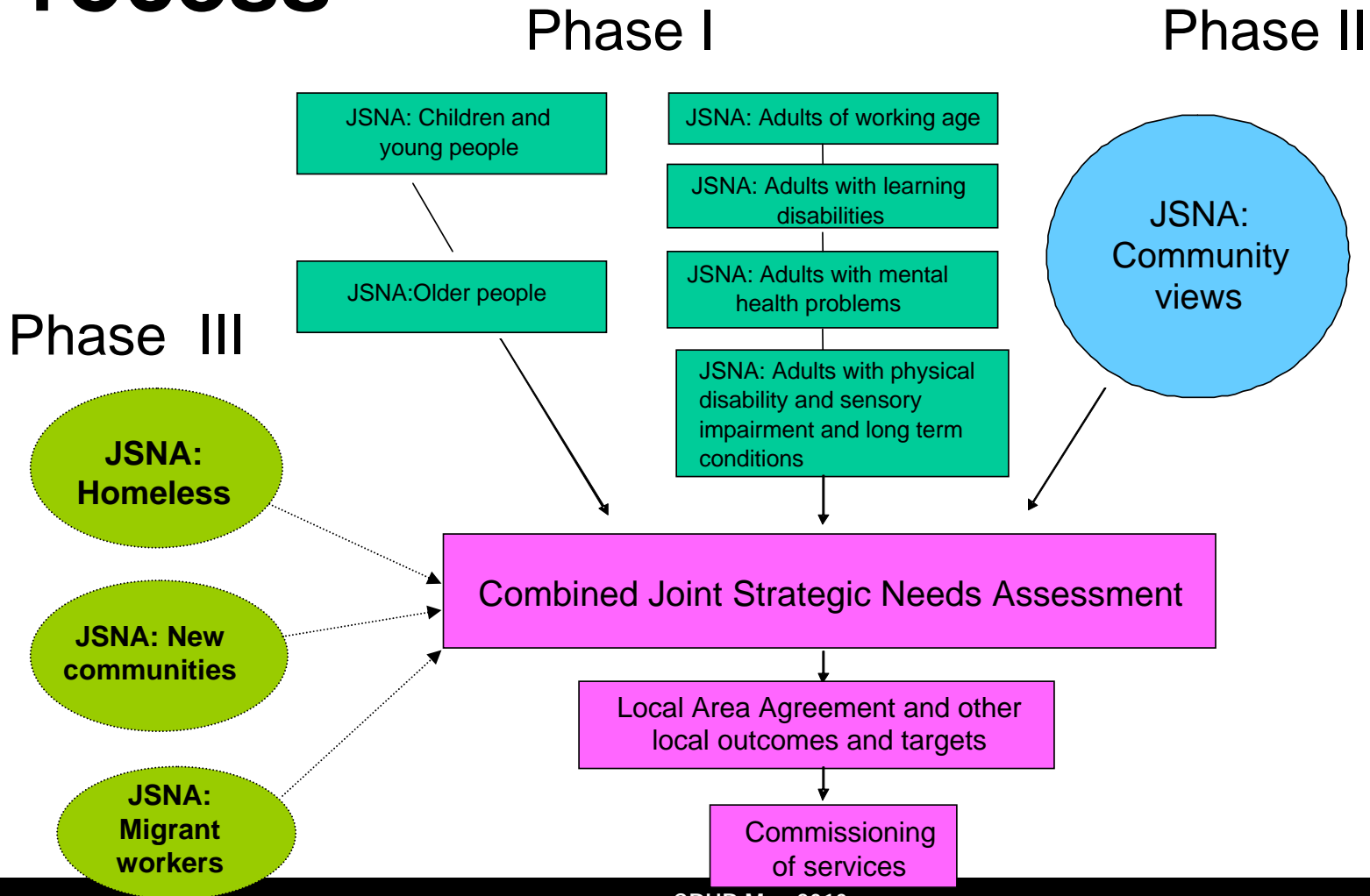

  - Mental health JSNA strand (including substance misuse)

# JSNA phase 4

- Increased focus on recommendations as well as data
- Data appendix on trends for key health statistics

# JSNA Communications Strategy

- Increase communication about the JSNA through presentations to stakeholders and community groups e.g. neighbourhood panels
- Develop a JSNA website, which could function as a ‘one stop shop’ with links to a range of needs assessment information for Cambridgeshire
