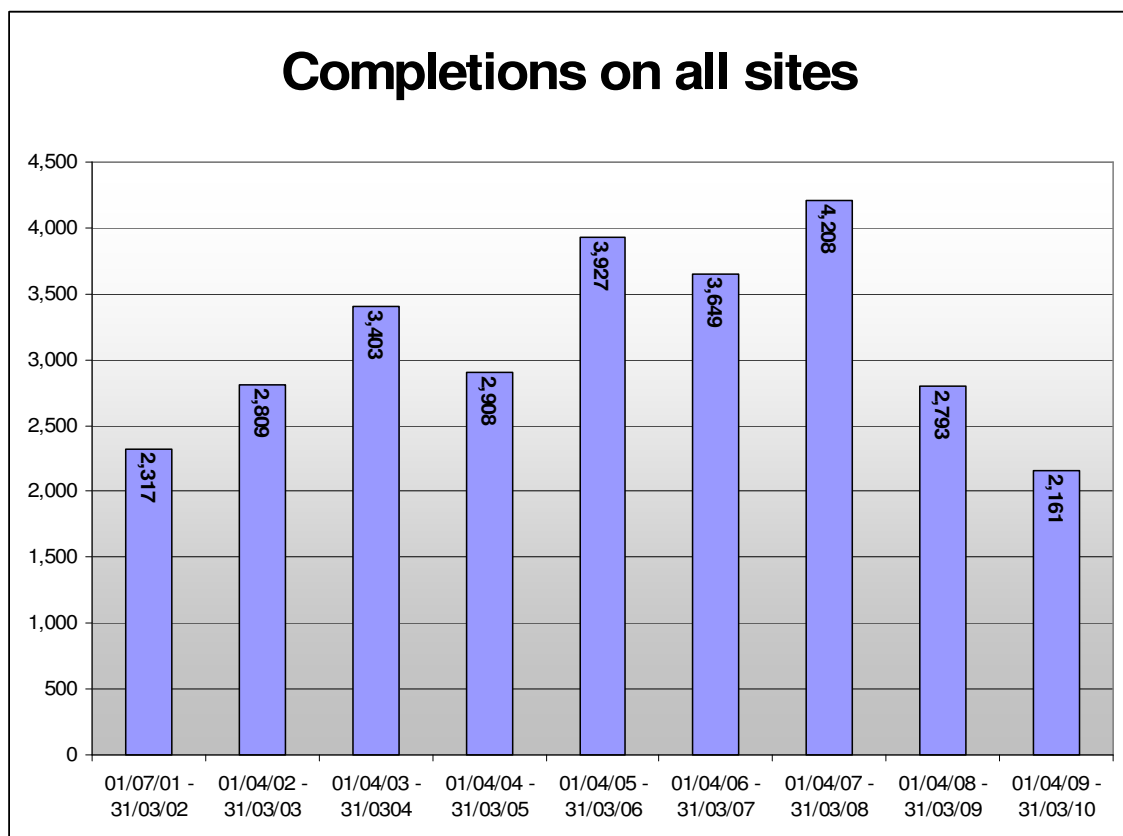

Overview

- 1.1 Cambridgeshire County Council undertakes a comprehensive survey each year to identify the number of housing completions on all sites by the end of March each year, and a quarterly update on sites of more than 100 homes.
- 1.2 This paper updates the Board on progress from September to December 2010 (quarter 3) for homes completed on larger sites across the County.

2. Housing Completions: a reminder of year-end outturn for all sites

- 2.1 The final outturn for the year ending 31 March 2010 showed delivery of 2,161 new homes across the County, on all sites. Of these, some 1,308 were completed on larger sites and 853 on smaller sites. This brings our overall total since July 2001 to **28,175** - an average of 3,131 homes completed per year over the 9 year period.
- 2.2 Around July 2011 the next “all sites” survey will be completed, giving our year-end outturn for sites of all sizes across the County.

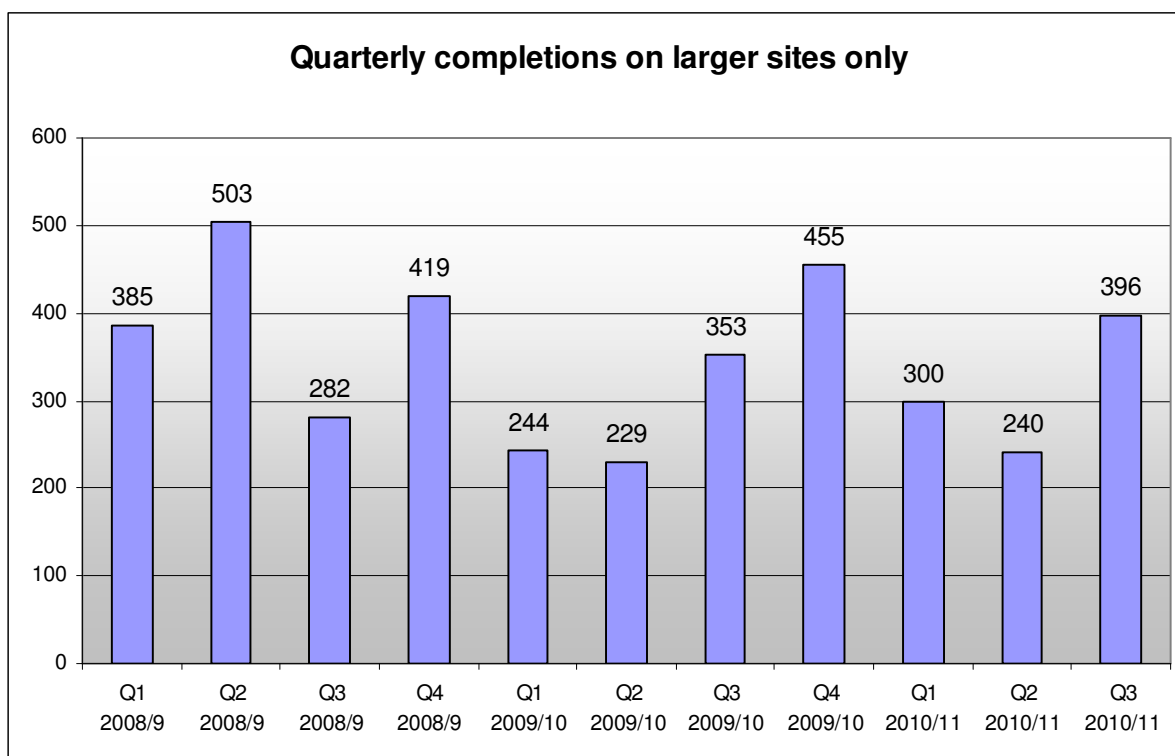


3. Housing Completions: update on Quarter 3 completions on larger sites

- 3.1 This paper updates the Board on the position at the end of December 2010 for homes built on larger sites.
- 3.2 The County’s latest quarterly survey shows that some 396 homes were completed between 1st October and 31st December 2010, a notable and

encouraging increase on the previous quarter's total of 240 completions (1st July to 30th September 2010).

- 3.3** The graph below provides comparative quarterly completions. Quarter 3 shows an improvement on the relatively low level of outturn in quarter 2 for the County.



4. Completions by district

- 4.1** In the first three quarters of 2010/11, the following homes were completed by district **on larger sites only**:

5. Starts on site

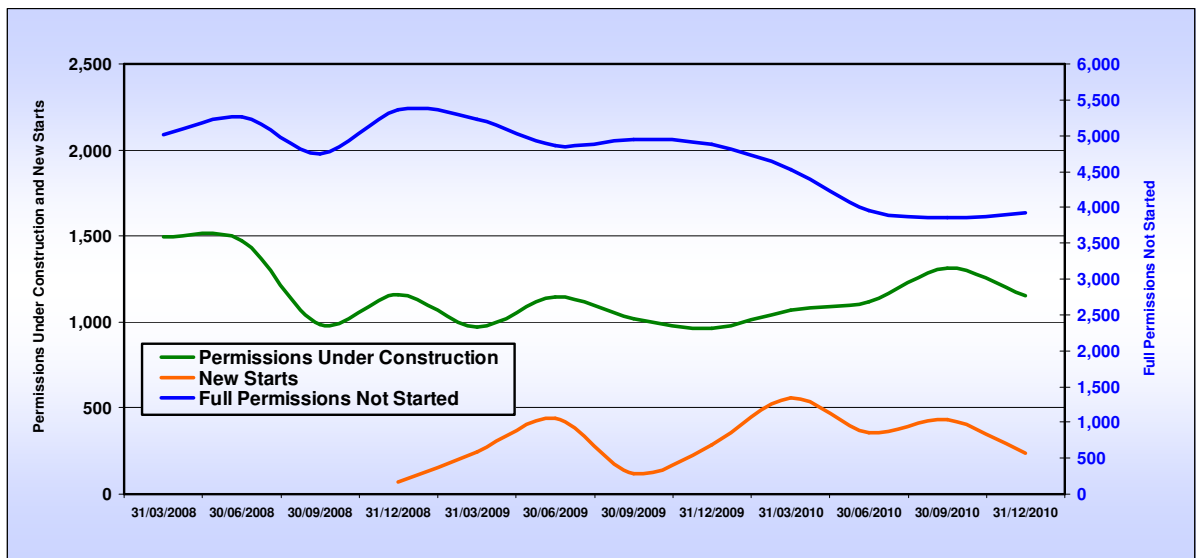
- 5.1** Some 238 homes were started on larger sites across the county, between September and December 2010, lower than some recent quarters, though the level does vary quite widely¹. See also the graph on page 4.

6. Future of “larger site” surveys

- 6.1** The current situation is that the County Research and Monitoring team carries out four surveys each year. At the end of the first, second and third quarters they complete a survey of the larger housing sites across the County. At the end of the financial year, an annual survey of all housing sites is undertaken, to monitor overall housing delivery.
- 6.2** The “larger sites” surveys (three per year) are completed for Cambridgeshire Horizons. The results of the survey are provided to:
- The sub-regional housing board;
 - Senior Officer Board;
 - Cambridgeshire Horizons Board; and
 - Published on the County Council’s website
 - Occasionally included in the sub-region’s Housing Market Bulletin.
- 6.3** Each survey costs approximately £2,000, adding up to £6,000 per year, currently funded from Cambridgeshire Horizons revenue. As Horizons is preparing for its imminent wind-down and needs to consider the future of these surveys and how they could be funded, if considered useful or a priority.

- 6.4** We understand the annual survey of all sites will continue regardless of the three “larger sites” survey in future, as part of the district annual monitoring reports or their successor documents.
- 6.5** At forthcoming meetings of JSGIC, CRHB, SOB and Horizons Board the question will be posed to gauge appetite for these larger sites surveys so, if we can seek alternative funding to carry the work on in future as necessary.

7. Recommendation

- 7.1** Board Members are invited to note progress in delivering new homes across the County to December 2010.
- 7.2** Board Members are invited to comment on the future of the three “larger site” surveys undertaken by the County Council which are used to create this report.
